New Town Mayor Elected.

At the Annual Town Council Meeting held on Monday 24th May 2010, Councillor Ben Nobbs was elected to serve as the Town Mayor and Chairman of Brigg Town Council.

Councillor Nobbs will be ably supported by Mrs. Barbara Morris, as the Lady Mayoress, who has previously served two terms of office as the Town Mayor of Brigg, in 1995/96 and again in 1998/99. The Town Mayor's Chaplain for the ensuing year will be the Methodist Minister, Rev. Enid Knowles.

The Town Mayor's Appeal will raise funds for two good causes; half of the proceeds at the end of the Mayoral Year will be donated to the Lincolnshire and Nottinghamshire Air Ambulance, and the other half will be used to assist with the purchase of new play equipment for one of the children's play areas in the Town.

Councillor John Kitwood was elected to serve as the Deputy Mayor/Town Mayor Elect and will be supported by his wife, Kathryn.

Before handing over the Chain of Office, Councillor James Truepeny thanked members for the honour of serving as Town Mayor, and recorded particular thanks to his Consort, Councillor Edward Arnott, as well as to the Deputy Mayor and Mayoress and Town Council staff, for all their support throughout his Mayoral Year. Councillor Truepeny and Councillor Arnott also presented cheques from the Town Mayor's Appeal Fund proceeds, in the sum of £1,142.52 each, to their two chosen charities, the Brigg Old Peoples' Welfare Committee and Let's Rock Cancer.

Brigg Big Spring Clean : A Huge Thank You to One and All

After reporting the election of the Town Mayor – the first business of this newsletter must be to record a huge thank you to everyone who has supported, or given time to help with the Brigg Big Spring Clean, **so far !**

There is more still to do but the joint efforts over the last 9 months of Brigg Town Council, the North Lincolnshire Council Neighbourhood Services Team, the Environment Agency and the previous MP, Mr. Ian Cawsey, have already resulted in what can only be described as a ‘fantastic community effort’ to clean up the riverside and the Town Centre.

Brigg A.T.C., Scunthorpe Sea Cadets, staff and young members of the 3B’s Youth Project, Brigg Guides, the W.I., Brigg & District Lions, the newly formed Brigg Youth Action Team, LincsSquad, Brigg Millennium Green Trust, the Ramblers, Link2Energy and Ink It UK, joined Brigg Town Councillors, the Clerk and the Angel Suite Manager, staff from the Neighbourhood Service Team and the Environment Agency, Sergeant Liz Staff from the Brigg Neighbourhood Policing Team, Andrew Percy MP and members of the general community in clean up events during the last two weeks of May. Thanks are also extended to C.P.R.E. and to the Wilkinsons Store for donating equipment.

Achievements to date:

70+ bags of rubbish, as well as larger items - such as shopping trolleys - removed from the river.

100 + bags of flytipped rubbish collected from the copse leading to the picnic area alongside the River Ancholme.

100 + bags of litter and weeds cleared from the Riverside, the Town Centre and Atherton Way.

Riverside paths edged, weeded and swept, as was the Cary Lane bus shelter and the seating outside the Wilkinsons Store on Cary Lane.
